

Investment Objective

Boston Partners Global Long/Short Fund is a long-biased portfolio which seeks long-term capital appreciation by investing both long and short in equities. The Fund pursues its objective by taking a diversified approach and aims to produce a consistent equity-like return but with less correlation and volatility when compared to the MSCI World Index (Net). The Fund will have a variable net exposure which is expected to be between 30%-70% over a full market cycle.

Fund Review - June 2025

Global equity markets climbed higher in June despite a flurry of events that could have impacted markets (i.e., Middle East bombings, policy uncertainty in the U.S., tariffs, persistent inflation, etc.). The Boston Partners Global Long/Short UCITS fund outpaced the MSCI World Index in June, rising 4.57% compared to a lesser increase of 4.32% for the Index. Both the long and the short portfolio added to relative returns, with the long portfolio increasing 2% more than the Index (up 6.32%) and the short portfolio lagging the Index, benefitting relative returns.

Within the long portfolio the fund added value in nearly every sector (8 of 10 invested sectors) with top contributors coming in Communication Services, Industrials and Information Technology. Within Communication services, off-benchmark holdings *NAVER Corp.* and *KT Corporation* climbed 43% and 12%, respectively, along with *Walt Disney Company*, which climbed higher by 10%. Within Industrials, off-benchmark holdings, again, drove strong performance, as *Babcock International*, *HD Korea Shipbuilding & Engineering* and *SPIE* increased by 25%, 18% and 10%, respectively. Lastly, in Information Technology, *Oracle Corporation*, *Applied Materials*, *Tokyo Electron* and *Micron Technology* all climbed 17% or higher, driving relative returns. Only two sectors detracted during the month, albeit slightly, with Consumer Staples and Materials partially offsetting returns.

In the short portfolio, top contributing short sectors came in Industrials, Consumer Discretionary and Consumer Staples. Within Industrials, the fund saw short positions in decline nearly 1%, a differential of almost 4% compared to the index. In Consumer Discretionary short positions also contributed positively, with slightly lower during the month, while index names climbed higher by over 1%. Lastly, Consumer staples short positions were down nearly 1%, benefitting relative returns. Only two sectors detracted meaningfully from relative returns on the short side, Information Technology and Financials, albeit slight.

Net exposure ticked slightly higher during the month, up to 46.4% from 44.4% net long at the end of May.



Investment Terms:

Price/Earnings Ratio: A method of valuing stocks, calculated by dividing the closing price of a company’s stock by its annual earnings per share. A higher multiple means investors have higher expectations for future growth and have bid up the stock’s price. P/E FY1 is simple measure of one-year earnings per share growth from the prior fiscal year (FY0) to the current fiscal year.

Return on Equity: A measure of a corporation’s profitability that reveals how much profit a company generates with the money shareholders have invested.

Alpha: A measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis. Alpha takes the volatility (price risk) of a product and compares its risk-adjusted performance to a benchmark index. The excess return of the product relative to the return of the benchmark index is the alpha.

Price-to-Book (P/B): The price per share of a stock divided by its book value (net worth) per share. For a portfolio, the ratio is the weighted average price-to-book ratio of the stocks that it holds.
